Information for Pet Owners TAKING CARE OF PETS DURING A DISASTER OR EMERGENCY

To be sure you can properly take care of your pet during an emergency like Hurricane Katrina, or during an evacuation, you must plan ahead.

If you have to leave your home, take your pet with you if at all possible. You are the best person to take care of your pet. Also, as the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) pointed out in a brochure it issued about preparing for a disaster, if the situation is dangerous for people, it is dangerous for animals, too.

But, before you leave, know where you can take your pet. Find out which motels or hotels are "pet friendly," or which ones will accept pets in an emergency. Or plan to go to the house of a friend or relative who will permit you to bring your pet.

Before you have to travel, get your pet used to a crate. Familiar surroundings might help ease a pet's anxiety. And getting an animal into a crate for travel will be easier once the animal is used to it.

Take pet food, medicines, vaccination records, and information about pet insurance if your have a policy. Assemble all of this into a disaster kit that you can grab as you leave.

Relying on a neighbor

If you get trapped away from your home due to a disaster or other emergency, your pet will be better off if you have already made arrangements with your neighbor or nearby friend to take care of the animal.

The temporary caretaker should have phone numbers to reach you (a cell phone number may be the best), and all the instruction necessary to properly care for the animal.

Those instructions should include a signed authorization for veterinary care, and financial limits to the veterinary care.

Afterward

Emergencies can make pets display unexpected or uncharacteristic behaviors. Well-behaved animals may become aggressive and defensive after a major disruption in their lives. The animal may not return to more typical behavior for several weeks. Be careful releasing an animal after an emergency, especially in unfamiliar surroundings. Make sure it cannot escape. Do not release the animal outside until you know the area is safe.

Allow your pet plenty of time to rest and get used to new surroundings. Provide familiar toys, if possible.

AVMA has prepared an extensive guide to preparing for emergencies, both for pet owners and livestock owners. It is available on AVMA's website, at www.avma.org/ disaster. Download a copy of "Saving the Whole Family."

The guide has checklists and helpful tips on preparing for disasters, and it explains the steps you should take once the warning has been sounded.

It has information about taking care of all types of pets, including birds and snakes. It also has information about preparing livestock.

MANE PULLING 101

You want to start with a clean mane. Do not condition it as the conditoner can make the mane too slick to easily work. You may also find that mane hairs pull out more easily immediately after your horse has worked, when his pores are open. Comb the mane until it is free of tangles and lying flat against the horse's neck. As you comb, evaluate the mane's thickness and length. A mane can vary in thickness down the neck, or in certain sections, especially for a horse with multiple colors in it's mane. Also keep an eye out for cowlicks. Do not pull too much hair in this area, as thinning will make the cowlick more prominent.

You will need a pulling comb. Begin at the base of your horse's neck, at the withers. This area of the mane is less sensitive for most horses than that up by the ears. So by starting there you will give your horse a chance to relax and accept the pulling procedure before you reach his more sensitive parts. Plus, mane hair at the withers tend to be thinner than that farther up the neck. You will want to match the rest of your horse's mane to the hair here.

Now use your left hand to secure a thin section of hair from the underneath portion of your horse's mane. You will thin from the underneath hairs so the top layer of mane can lie smoothly over them. Select a section no larger than 1/2 inch diameter. Sections larger than this can be painful to your horse.

Using the mane comb in your right hand, thin the section further by pushing the comb up the hair, toward the neck's crest. Wrap the thinned section of hair two times around the mane comb, so you have leverage for removing the hair with less risk of the mane slipping out of the comb. Once you have made your double wrap, simply hold the comb with downward pressure against your horse's neck. If you were to tug and rip out the hairs, you would startle your hose and cause him pain. By applying gentle downward pressure as you touch his neck you will help keep him relaxed, allowing you to pull out hairs more easily. Repeat this process all the way up the horse's neck.

FOREVER FLORIDA began as a young man's dream.

Allen Broussard loved roaming the area next to the family's Crescent J Ranch as a boy, and when he became a Wildlife Ecologist, he came to understand its ecological value. It had been divided up into lots just by drawing lines on paper and sold to unsuspecting buyers all over the U.S., sight unseen, in the 1960's and 70's, until a law finally was passed putting an end to such sales.

As a teenager, Allen contracted Hodgkin's Disease and later, while in Graduate School working on a PhD, he needed a heart transplant due to damage to his heart from the cancer treatments. While in the hospital awaiting a donor, he told his father, Dr. William Broussard, about how rare unspoiled Florida ecosystems had become and how important it is to save as much as possible of those native systems. It was Allen's dream to preserve it.

Dr. Broussard, an Ophthalmologist and 10th- generation rancher from Louisiana, and his wife, Margaret, founded the Allen Broussard Conservancy, a not-for-profit Scientific Corporation created for the purpose of purchasing the land and keeping it as a wildlife preserve. Fortunately, the property was in pristine condition and had not been developed due to its remoteness and extensive wetlands.

Today, Allen's dream has become a reality. Forever Florida, together with the Crescent J Ranch, comprise a 4,700-acre cattle ranch and nature preserve combining "Old Florida" charm with an exciting and educational opportunity to view native animals and plants in their natural environment.

adventure Safaris

Horseback Safaris - Standard one-hour, two-hour, or three-hour horseback safaris are available daily. Horseback Safaris can be arranged for riders with varying levels of experience. All guests should be at least 12 years of age; 10 years of age is an acceptable age with proven riding experience. Guests weighing more than 275 pounds will need to be assessed by our Equestrian Director before they are allowed to take a Horseback Safari. Call-in reservations are recommended in order to assure that we and our horses are ready for you.

A favorite with visitors is our two-night "Crescent J Cattle Drive Weekend Safari," which includes some training in Florida Cowhunter skills of ridin', ropin' and cow cuttin'. (Florida cattlemen weren't "cowboys" because hunting those wild Spanish-descent cattle in Florida's woods and swamps was a man's job, they said.) Choice of campground depends on weather, type of group and recommendation of the riding instructors.

Another favorite is similar, but shorter – an Overnight Trail Ride Safari combined with a next-day "Rawhide Roundup." More time is spent riding the wilderness trails of Forever Florida and learning about nature, less on cowpoke skills.
