



Profit Boosting Ideas For Your Stable

Good horsemanship is built on solid basics...So is good business!

If you provide horse care as all or part of how you earn money, you know that it is: a) hard work, b) time consuming, c) the overhead is high, and d) that the costs for supplies only seem to keep going up, up, up. Let's take a look at some ways that you can convert your hard work into increased profitability for your stable. Time is money. Where does YOUR time go?



Most stables charge their boarders on a per month basis. A daily rate is also calculated for partial month habitation. Although stable operators may have taken

all costs into account when establishing their rates, it is not unusual that the amount of time required for horse care is given short shrift. In some cases, when the boarding business may have started out as a means to pay for the stable owner's horse, the time it takes hasn't been factored in at all. Their time is considered "free labor."


Let's use \$350.00/month as an example, with a daily rate of \$12/day. Let's also say that his fee is all-inclusive. There are no "extra's" that are charged for, although they are all attended to. Horses are bug-sprayed and blanketed as needed, as well as provided extra grain and/or bedding if needed. How much time does it take per hours per day for care provided in this fee? To determine this evaluate the tasks that are provided as part of this fee. Make a list of them- all of them- don't omit any task.

Your primary care list will likely include: Basic feeding, watering, mucking, and turnout. What is included in basic feeding - how many times per day is the horse fed, are supplements included? How much time per horse does it take for you to do all the feed chores you provide? Filling the grain bucket from the grain bag or bin, adding supplement extras, delivering to the horse, cleaning the grain tub, tossing hay down from the loft, delivering the hay to the horse, all need to be added in. Let's say you feed 3 times per day and that it takes 5 minutes per horse, per feeding.

How about watering and keeping water buckets and tubs clean? Or do you have automatic waterers, which help provide a time saving task? Let's add on 5 more minutes for this.

How long does it take you to clean a stall? This will also depend on how much time the horse spends in the stall, whether or not the horse is tidy in its habits, and how many times a day you pick the stall out following the daily cleaning. Add 25 minutes here, and remember that it also takes time to get the manure to the manure pile, as well as to rebed the stall.

So far 35 minutes has ticked by. Add another 10 minutes for turnout, to get the horse out and back in and bug sprayed or blanketed



as needed. All these time allotments are estimates and don't take into account extremes - like horses that aren't turned out at all, or horses that are turned out in a pasture that is 1/4 mile away or, tack cleaning, saddle pad laundering, and blanket wash/repair. A total of 45 minutes per day per horse for basic care multiplied by 30 days a month is 22.5 hours per month. Figure labor at \$6.50/hour and that means \$146.25/month on basic labor.

That's not all either. Other horse care tasks may also include catching for veterinarian, farrier or other service provider, holding for the same service providers, booting/bandaging, worming. And what about these tasks: grooming, bathing, trimming/clipping, sheath cleaning, supply replacement (liniment, supplements, bug spray, saddle soap/oil are examples) in their needs and requirements for horse care? If your policy is to clean stalls once a day, and some of your clients may want their horse's stall picked out more than once a day, establish an additional cost for this. Do you have to catch a horse and attend to it while the vet or farrier works on it, and then return it to the pasture? Establish a fee for this, and remember that time involved may vary from a hoof trimming, to walking a colicky horse for several hours. The horse owner might perform some of these tasks. But if you are looking to increase your profitability, the services you provide is one area that can help you to accomplish that.




What about "people" time? At this point, horse time has been taken into consideration, but "people" time has not. People are another overlooked component of the horse care equation. Let's face it, just like horses, some people are high maintenance, and some are easy keepers. This is another good area in which to establish a baseline. Although this is not yet a standard practice in the horse industry, consider including in your boarding fee a set amount of time per month for consultation with the client about their horse. For example, if you provide up to one hour, that may be used as about 2 minutes/day, 15 minutes/week, or one hour all at once. Set a fee for time used over that and refer to it as Individual Client Consultation.

Set standard provisions for feed and bedding. As you have probably already discovered, all horses are not created equal. Some horses are very neat in their stalls, leaving all their manure in one pile, thus minimizing the amount of cleaning time and bedding replacement. Some horses churn their stalls leaving such a mess that you wonder if they had a slumber party in there with 5 other horses. Many horses fall somewhere in the middle. Many stable owners have decided that the hard keepers are balanced out by the easy keepers. The easy keeper gets less bedding while the hard keeper gets more. Another way to look at this is for the stable to provide X amount of bedding per week. Hard keepers, or owners simply desiring more bedding for their horse will be billed at an additional set rate. Feed amounts for hay and grain can be set in a

similar way.

Going back to the example set earlier, with basic labor costs of \$146.25/month, and let's also assume 100# of grain per horse (\$15), 15 bales of hay (\$52.50), and 6 bags of shavings per month (\$21). Add another \$15 for client consultation time (charged at a higher rate since it will be barn manager, trainer, or instructor that is more likely to perform this). These basics total \$249.75. Add onto this barn, fence and property maintenance costs, insurance, mortgage, property taxes, electric and utilities, workers comp, equipment maintenance, office supplies, marketing, and any other stable related costs, it's easy to see any profit shrinking away. By setting baseline services and feed and bedding amounts, you take a positive step in controlling one aspect of cost waste that will result in improved profitability.

Put it in writing. Put your fees in writing, along with your policies. Make them available to prospects as well as new and established clients. If people know ahead of time what the prices and policies are, they are less likely to develop hard feelings that may occur if they are billed for services they weren't made aware. Once your policies and fees are established, enforce them. People will respect the top-level care available, your ability to provide the services they need your professionalism, your equitable treatment of all clients and the security of knowing that you will be around over a longer time frame because you charge what you need to in order to stay in business. Remember that how your clients perceive your fee structure is also largely a matter of how you present it to them. Make it a point that you are proud to be able to offer all the services that you do, and that you are conscious of your clients' time constraints. Offer your services both as a menu to choose from, as well as offering a full-service package that includes all. This allows clients to choose the services that best suit their needs.



Get a handle on time wasters. What things happen during the course of a week that leaves you with wasted time? Not all situations are under your control, but some time wasters can be an added drain to your profitability. Do you let telephone calls interrupt your day? Yes, accessibility is a good thing, but not if it significantly slows down or interrupts your chores, lessons, or training. Let your voice mail pick up, then assign certain times for callbacks. Two call times may work well, one for daytime call, one for evening calls. You can't control other people's scheduling problems, but you can respond to them. For example, some stables set two fees for lessons - \$X and the horse is all tacked up for you and you get a full hour, or \$X minus and you tack up the horse and get what remains of the hour. And you service providers? Be clear about your scheduling needs and the importance of communication. Work together to establish courtesy calls for cancellation or notification for unexpected appointment changes. If you respect your time, your provider's time, and your clients, it will be reflected back to you. Your reputation and your bottom line will increase.



They say, “A picture is worth a thousand words,” but when I see how far my horse and I have come together, I could find inspiration for twice as many. My name is Brittany Rivers. My horse is CODE RED. I bought Red because I needed a horse that I could get serious about competition with. But, when instead of improving our skills, we were LOSING them, I knew the hinderance was me. Of course, I went through the blame game. “It’s this stupid horse. He just never listens.” Then, I resorted to using harsher equipment to “make” him do things. Finally, I had to admit as I looked into his eyes I may be capable of forcing the results I wanted out of him. Still, it would never be possible to control his feelings or “make” him like me.



So, I began the journey of learning what HE needed. As I began to apply the techniques I had learned, our relationship transformed. I started using less micro-managing gadgets and more communication effective tools until eventually I didn’t need anything! When I realized what I had invested in with my horse, I could now offer to other horses and riders I grew more passionate about all the details. I recently returned to Naples after apprenticing with Kirsten Nelson of Wexford Training. I highly regard her teaching and training theories. Studying with her helped me understand the physical needs horses have and how it interconnects with their mental and emotional development. Now, I thrive on the challenges each horse has to offer. All horses are so very different. Bold, determined, lazy, timid, powerful. I believe in meeting them where they are currently, and challenging them to develop new skills. I also believe in helping horse owners become the leaders their equine partners need them to be. If I can teach people how to convey what they want from their

horses in a way the horse can understand, not only would the relationship be rewarding for both partners, but also MUCH SAFER! So much of the horse’s expressions are misinterpreted. Such as, how they cope with bad saddle fit, but someone willing to understand deserves the respect and trust horses have to give.

Currently I am at Cloud9 Ranch, where we don’t pretend to have been born with this knowledge or understanding. We are grateful for the journey that gave us our learning experiences and the ability to relate to you. So, don’t let frustration and confusion be a

barrier between you and your horse... LEARN!


