WHAT IS CHIROPRACTIC FOR HORSES?

Chiropractic care is a holistic approach to many health and performance problems of the horse. Chiropractic does not replace traditional veterinary medicine and surgery, but provides an alternative method of care. Chiropractic adjustments have proven to be invaluable in detecting and treating gait abnormalities and other performance-robbing problems in the athletic horse.

HOW DO I KNOW IF MY HORSE NEEDS CHI-ROPRACTIC CARE?

Ø Loss or decrease in level of performance.

Ø Problems or difficulty executing desired movements.

Ø Behavioral changes (i.e. refusals, cinchy, bucking).

Ø Short striding

 \varnothing Diagnosed conditions, such as degenerative arthritis.

Ø Muscle imbalance, spasms, or atrophy.

Ø Gait problems, such as cross canter, loss of collection, refusal to pick up lead.

Ø An injury resulting from falls, training or other activities.

Ø Stressful situations, such as conformation of the horse, various riding and training equipment, performance level and ability of the rider, shoeing.

Symptoms such as lameness, stiffness, lack of impulsion or power, difficulty in obtaining or maintaining collection, poor attitude, gait abnormalities, being cold-backed or cinchy, or the presence of muscle atrophy are commonly associated with spinal misalignments.

HOW DOES A CHIROPRACTOR ADJUST AN ANIMAL AS LARGE AS A HORSE?

To answer this, it is important to remember that the

chiropractor is not adjusting the entire horse, but rather a specific joint in the spine.

Initially, a complete chiropractic examination is performed. This typically includes a case history; including any veterinary work performed, posture analysis, gait analysis, static and motion palpation of the spine and its joints, muscle palpation and checking for any changes in temperature over the spine.

Once the initial exam has been completed, the chiropractor will perform an adjustment on the area of the spine affected. This helps to return the joints to normal motion, and to alleviate muscle spasms and pain. A chiropractic adjustment is very specific, high velocity, low force controlled thrust by hand, which is directed in a specific direction on a specific joint.

THE VETERINARIAN/CHIROPRACTOR TEAM

The goal here is to find the primary source of pain, rather than treating what might be a secondary source. In equine practice, back problems and leg injuries are often inter-related. Chiropractic provides expertise in the evaluation of back and joint problems that can provide veterinarians with additional means of diagnosis and early treatment options in certain lameness problems; especially conservative treatment of biomechanical-related musculoskeletal disorders.

It should be stressed that chiropractic, in no way, should be thought of as a replacement for conventional veterinary medicine, but rather as a valid, concurrent, complimentary treatment procedure for many back and lameness problems. As with any health related problem or condition that your horse

may experience, it is important that your veterinarian be contacted, initially, so the he/she can assess your horse for any underlying medical conditions that could be causing similar symptoms.

Equestrian Definitions A . 1

If you're fairly new to the horse scene, you've probably heard more experienced equestrians throwing around words you don't understand. For your education and amusement, here are some definitions of common equestrian terms.

Auction A popular, social gathering where you can change a horse from a financial liability into a liquid asset.

Azoturia (Monday Morning Disease) a condition brought on by showing horses all weekend. Symptoms include the feeling of dread at having to get out of bed on Mondays and go to work.

Barn Sour An affliction common to horse people in northern climates during the winter months. Trudging through deep snow, pushing wheelbarrows through snow and beating out frozen water buckets tend to bring on this condition rapidly.

Big Name Trainer Cult Leader: Horse owners follow them blindly, will gladly sell their homes, spend their children's college funds and their IRA's to support them- as they have a direct link to "The Most High Ones" (Judges).

Bog Spavin The feeling of panic when riding through marshy area. Also used to refer to horses who throw a fit at having to go through water puddles.

Bolt to gulp feed usually occurs with sandwiches at half-hour holds.

Bran A wheat by-product occasionally fed moistened to horses, most usually applied as spackle or stucco on owner.

Colic The gastrointestinal result of eating at the food stands at horse shows.

Colt What your mare always gives you when you want a filly.

Contracted foot The involuntary/instant reflex of curling one's toes up - right before a horse steps on your foot.

Corn small callus growths formed from the continual wearing of cowboy boots.

Cribbing The vice of chewing your pencils while worrying as you figuring cost of next year's hay.

Drench Term used to describe the condition an owner is in after he administers mineral oil to his horse.

Picayune Strand State Forest

Picayune Strand State Forest is in the heart of an ecosystem called the Big Cypress Basin. The majority of this forest is under water during periods of considerable rainfall. The forest is comprised of cypress strands, wet prairie, and pine flatwoods in the lowlands and subtropical hardwood hammocks in the uplands. The northern section of the Belle Meade Tract contains many second growth South Florida slash pine, with some remnant trees being over 100 years old. The forest provides habitat for many species of wildlife making wildlife viewing a popular activity. The following species have been sighted in the forest: black bear, bald eagle, wood stork, Big Cypress fox squirrel and swallow-tailed kites. Although Florida panthers are rarely visible, they do leave tracks for the observant visitor. Female panthers have borne cubs in the state forest in recent years.

Picayune Strand State Forest offers many recreational opportunities. A 22 mile horse trail winds across the Belle Meade Tract from Miller Boulevard to Benfield Rd. All horses in the forest must have current negative Coggins Test results, proof of which is to be carried by each rider. Horses may be rented at M and H stables which is located 2 miles south of Exit 15 off Interstate 75 at 2750 Newman Drive. Also on Newman Drive is Everglades Ranch, a boarding facility. They offer daily or overnight boarding if you wish

to vacation at the Picayune Strand State Forest with your own horse. An oak shaded primitive camping area can be found near the middle of the trail.

The rate of decline of maternal antibodies varies for both individual foals and different disease agents. For many



important diseases, the concentration of maternal antibodies in foals falls to nonprotective levels by 2 to 3 months of age. However, the remaining antibodies can still render the foal unresponsive to vaccination for weeks to come. For this reason, the American Association of Equine Practitioners currently recom-

mends beginning foal vaccinations at 3 to 4 months for life threatening diseases such as Tetanus and Encephalomyelitis and delaying Influenza vaccinations until the foal is at least 7 months old.

3 months of age: VEWT #1 & Strep in #1

Booster in 3 weeks: VEWT #2 & Strep in #2

10 months of age: Flu IN #1, PHF/Rabies

Booster in 3 weeks: VEWT, Flu in #2, PHF #2

VanRoekel & Associates recommends deworming foals monthly. Foals that are eating well or are weaned may be started on the Strongid C program to prevent roundworm migration through the lungs. Foals that are eating well may be weaned two weeks after the second vaccinations.
