How can we eliminate horse flies?

How can we eliminate horse flies? We try various fly sprays twice daily to no avail. What actually attracts horseflies, and how do they breed? (in manure, like house flies)?



Horse flies are one of the most problematic flies and one of the most difficult to control. The nature of this fly makes it almost impossible to eliminate through spraying programs. A horse fly will travel up to 15 to 20 miles for a blood meal,

unlike mosquitoes, which will travel only 100 feet. Ultimate fly control includes eliminating all possible breeding grounds and feeding sources. This type of fly control is almost impossible with the horse fly, as can be seen in its biology. Horse flies do not breed indoors like houseflies. Females often lay eggs in specific locations, such as on vegetation overhanging water. Species are often locally abundant near breeding habitats, and the various species have distinctive adult activity periods during the year and/or during the day. Larvae live in species-specific habitats, most of which are aquatic, semi-aquatic or terrestrial.

In terms of treating horses, the most popular product is Permethrin-10 Concentrate. Permethrin-10 is one of the few materials on the market that can safely be used as a spray or wash for horses. It is a multi-use insecticide for indoors, outdoors, on animals and animal premises. It is very popular with veterinarians for its ability to control biting flies on horses, dogs and livestock. As safe as this product is for most mammals, it is not to be used as a spray, dip or rinse for cats, and should only be applied to the animals listed on the label. There are also fly and tick control treatments that you put on the middle of the horse's back much like the Frontline product used on dogs and cats. Always read and follow the label instructions when using insect control products.

WEST NILE VIRUS & ANIMALS



Q. Are animals other than birds and horses affected by the virus?

A. Experimental tests suggest that sheep, chickens, and pigs could be affected by WNV. Two cases of illness caused by WNV were detected in sheep in the United States in 2002. In tests, the virus caused pregnant sheep to abort. Cows may show antibodies to the virus, which means they have contracted it without showing any clinical signs or becoming ill.

Q. What signs of illness do horses exhibit when infected with the virus?

A. NVSL positively identified WNV as the cause in horses showing signs of encephalitis. Clinical signs of the virus in horses included ataxia (stumbling or incoordination),

weakness of limbs, partial paralysis, or death. A fever was not often observed.

West Nile Hits Trailer Park in Florida!



All kidding aside, West Nile Virus (WNV) season is upon us. Be prepared. These Q&As are provided by the USDA APHIS web site and the Mosquito tips are provided by the USGS's National Wildlife Health Center's NBII web site.

Q. What precautions can be taken to protect animals from WNV?

A. Preventing animals' exposure to mosquitoes is essential. The best way to do this is by removing any potential sources of water in which mosquitoes can breed. Dispose of any water-holding containers, including discarded tires. Drill holes in the bottom of containers that are left outside. Clean clogged roof gutters on an annual basis. Turn over wading pools or wheelbarrows when not in use, and do not allow water to stagnate in bird baths. Aerate ornamental pools or stock them with fish. Clean and chlorinate swimming pools that are not in use and be aware that mosquitoes can breed in the water that collects on swimming pool covers. Use landscaping to eliminate standing water that collects on your property; mosquitoes can breed in any puddle that lasts more than 4 days. Thoroughly clean livestock-watering troughs on a monthly basis. Local mosquito-control authorities can help in assessing the mosquito-breeding risks associated with your property.

Pet birds can also be protected by limiting their exposure to mosquitoes. In areas reporting large numbers of wild bird deaths, investigations are conducted and samples collected to determine the cause of the deaths. People finding dead wild birds should notify local health officials. No treatment is currently available for WNV; however, APHIS Veterinary Services is working to assist all companies interested in producing a vaccine. On August 1, 2001, USDA issued a conditional license to Fort Dodge Animal Health of Fort Dodge, IA, a division of Wyeth, for a vaccine intended to aid in the prevention of the disease in horses. In November 2002, a full license was granted for this product. Use of this product is restricted to licensed veterinarians.

Q. Are dogs and cats affected by the virus?

A. It is unlikely that dogs or cats will show signs of clinical illness, although any mammal or bird could potentially be exposed to the virus through mosquito bites. A survey of blood samples from dogs and cats in the New York City epidemic area showed a low infection rate.

Mosquito Control and West Nile Virus

Preventive measures to reduce your risk for WNV infections include reduction of mosquito breeding sites and prevention of mosquito bites.

Reducing Mosquito Breeding sites in your yard and neighborhood

Eliminate sources of standing water in your yard where mosquitoes may lay eggs. Fill, cover or remove any items that can trap water. Common mosquito breeding containers include:

- Bird baths change the water at least once or twice a week, cleaning the bath on a regular basis
- Outdoor pet dishes change the water daily, not only to prevent mosquito breeding, but also for your pet's health
- Flower pots remove any overflow water that has collected in the dish beneath the pot

Ponds - consider purchasing mosquito-eating fish if the pond is serving as a mosquito breeding site

- and cannot be drained
- Tires
- Gutters clean and remove debris on a regular basis to prevent water from collecting
- Wheelbarrows
- Wading pools
- Trashcan lids and recycling bins
- Puddles/ditches in your yard or driveway
- Swimming pools (not in use) keep pool water aerated and chlorinated; cover when not in use

Trim grass regularly

Preventing Mosquito Bites



ALWAYS FOLLOW MANUFACTURER'S INSTRUCTIONS ON REPELLENT USE!

- Use a mosquito repellant, such as one containing DEET when outdoors. Look for "DEET" or "N,Ndiethyl-m-toluamide" or "N,N-diethly-3methylbenamide" on the product label.
- Wear light-colored, long-sleeved shirts and pants, as well as covered shoes with socks, in mosquito-infested areas; you may wish to wear mosquito netting over your face as well.
- Limit outdoor activities at dawn, dusk, and early evening, when mosquitoes are most active



More About DEET

According to a recent study, products containing about 24% DEET were effective for an average of 5 hours against mosquitoes; a product with 20% DEET was effective for about 4 hours; and a product with about 6.5% DEET was effective for about 2 hours. Weigh the strength of DEET you use against the number of hours you will be exposed outdoors. Remember that you can and should re-apply DEET if you extend your time outdoors.

- Concentrations up to 35% DEET may be used by adults; higher concentrations are not more effective at preventing bites. The percentage of DEET in a product has more to do with its "staying power" than its effectiveness at warding off mosquitoes. A product with 50% DEET is not really more effective at preventing mosquito bites, but simply lasts longer on the skin than a product containing 20% DEET.
- Use formulas with a maximum concentration of 10% DEET on children, and don't allow them to apply the product themselves; avoid using DEET on infants and toddlers
- **Don't** apply DEET products to your face, as it should be kept away from eyes and mouth.
- Don't apply DEET products to sunburned, cracked, bruised, or irritated skin
- Apply DEET in ventilated areas
- Use DEET products sparingly, and apply only to exposed skin and to clothing
- DEET may damage synthetic fabrics
- Although DEET has been tested extensively on humans and has been deemed safe when used properly, you should avoid prolonged exposure to it; wash skin and clothing after returning indoors
- If you suspect that you are having an adverse reaction to a product containing DEET, wash it off immediately and contact a doctor or poison control center
- **Don't** use DEET on your pets; if they ingest it by licking or cleaning themselves, they could become seriously ill.

Horseback Safaris - Standard one-hour, two-hour, or threehour horseback safaris are available daily. Horseback Safaris can be arranged for riders with varying levels of experience. All guests should be

at least 12 years of age; 10 years of age is an acceptable age with proven riding experience. Guests weighing more than 275 pounds will need to be assessed by our Equestrian Director before they are allowed to take a Horseback Safari. Call-in reservations are recommended in order to assure that we and our horses are ready for you.

A favorite with visitors is our two-night "Crescent J Cattle Drive Weekend Safari," which includes some training in Florida Cowhunter skills of ridin', ropin' and cow cuttin'. (Florida cattlemen weren't "cowboys" because hunting those wild Spanish-descent cattle in Florida's woods and swamps was a man's job, they said.) Choice of campground depends on weather, type of group and recommendation of the riding instructors.

Another favorite is similar, but shorter – an Overnight Trail Ride Safari combined with a next-day "Rawhide Roundup." More time is spent riding the wilderness trails of Forever Florida and learning about nature, less on cowpoke skills.

Corporate Co-workers, Schoolteachers, Professional Club, Flying Clubs, School Groups, Church Groups, Families, Friends, Scout troops or multi-troop Camporees - there are activities and a campground on Forever Florida or the Crescent J Ranch that are just right for a bonding experience. See the Facilities and Events page for more details.

From a small primitive one-troop Scout Camp on the Crescent J that has been used by Girl and Boy Scouts for more than 30 years, we expanded to a remote but up-scale campground 'way back in the wilderness of Forever Florida, then added two campgrounds in between and most recently, a large area "up front" (near the highway) that comfortably holds up to twenty Scout troops for a big Camporee.
